PROFILE DESCRIPTION

Administration presented three options for the Turf Maintenance Enhancement Program in CR 5463 on October 17th, 2018. Committee requested Option B be presented as part of the 2019-2022 capital budget deliberations.

Option B requests a one-time capital investment of \$500,000 for new equipment to increase Turf Health Care (THC) practices on an ongoing basis on 100 additional sports fields throughout the City of Edmonton.

In addition, Option B will maintain the Turf Maintenance Enhancement Program as delivered in 2018 including the application of Iron Chelate on sports fields for weed control and a weekly mowing cycle for 6 weeks across the entire City turf inventory.

Current State of Equipment

To implement the THC program, operations deploys several pieces of equipment including agricultural tractors, top dressers, over seeders, fertilizer spreaders, aerators and dethatchers.

Our current equipment inventory is maximized and can only annually support the THC program on 100 fields across the city.

Proposed Equipment Investment

To implement the THC program on an additional 100 fields city wide, administration requests capital funding for morel equipment. With capital funding of \$500,000, administration will acquire the following equipment while maintaining our current inventory:

2 Agricultural tractors (\$100,000 each)

2 overseeders (\$18,000 each)

2 top dressers (\$38,000 each)

2 aerators (\$45,000 each)

2 fertilizer spreaders (\$9,000 each)

1 GPS line marker (\$20,000 each)

Contingency (\$60,000)

Should this capital funding request be approved, administration will upgrade to modern equipment as well as increase equipment availability to reach our goal.

PROFILE BACKGROUND

Administration requires additional turf care equipment to meet the service levels identified in Option B of CR_5463. This equipment will increase turf health care operations and sustainably improve the resilience of turf in the city.

THC practices are the best way to ensure vitality and long term sustainability of turfgrass. They reduce susceptibility of turfgrass to health problems including diseases, weeds, pests and stress by improving the individual plant's health and vigor. This proactive approach to maintaining turf health through holistic cultural management and integrated treatments includes: dethatching, aeration, top dressing, overseeding, fertilization and irrigation.

Additional equipment inventory would increase THC service levels from once every 14 to 16 years per sports field to once every 7 to 8 years. This will increase the number of fields receiving THC treatment from 100 to 200 per season. This is a significant change that will improve the quality of our Sport Field inventory while also increasing playtime and safety for users.

PROFILE JUSTIFICATION

Turf Health Care is a highly mechanised activity using various equipment. Increasing THC equipment inventory has a direct impact on expanding our THC program to an additional 100 fields.

This expansion will lead to better quality play surfaces on sports fields across Edmonton and will reduce the cycle time between care. Better quality turf has better health and vigor hence greater resistance to diseases, better tolerance of low moisture levels, and better suppression of weed colonies. It will provide a surface that allows players to compete safely and at a reasonable level of competition.

STRATEGIC ALIGNMENT

This profile supports maintaining or improving service levels by providing well maintained turf and sports fields. The profile also supports the connection of people to what matters to them and demonstrates concern about the impact of our actions on our social, cultural and environmental systems.

The future Turf Management Policy aims to address overall equipment stewardship.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

The City of Edmonton is committed to providing safe and aesthetically-pleasing outdoor park environments. Healthy, properly-maintained green spaces contribute substantially to human wellness by reducing stress and encouraging physical activity.
