### MGA – Red Tape Reduction Review

- Amended regulations on off-site levies and Growth Management Boards published May 27
- Province now holding stakeholder engagement sessions on five Governance topics (Parts 1-8)
  - Written submissions due by June 15
  - MGA amendments planned for Fall 2021
- Review of Assessment and Taxation (Parts 9-10) to take place in 2022
