

Gender Based Analysis - Reimagine Services Update

The COVID-19 pandemic is disproportionately impacting members of marginalized groups and vulnerable populations. As Administration reimagines how best to relaunch and recover from the ongoing pandemic and economic recession, careful consideration is being given to the use of GBA+ in order to minimize inequalities and barriers for Edmontonians. Listed below are the Reimagine Actions and the GBA impacts with each action.
