# Updates to the Bylaw

- Fine amount has been increased from \$500 to \$1,000.
- Professional Biologist has been added as an acceptable designation to write or sign-off on a tree preservation plan.




#### **Tree Permit Process**

Permit is issued assuming application meets requirements. Site inspection may be conducted after for some projects

Visit eServices platform before work begins 2 5 Start permit application DP, BP, OSCAM, ULA or Tree Permit 3 4 Confirm if work is within 5 m of a Boulevard or Open Complete application and submit tree protection or Space tree or 10 m of a preservation plan Natural Stand

# **Blanket Permits** | Utility and Telecom Organizations



Excavation between 3 to 5 meters of a boulevard or open space tree and between 5 to 10 meters of a natural stand

### **Permit Fee Options**

| <b>Fee Option</b><br>% of Forestry Costs | Tree Protection<br>Permit Fee | Tree Preservation<br>Permit Fee |
|--|-------------------------------|---------------------------------|
| Fee 100% - Funding 0%                    | \$100                         | \$300                           |
| Fee 50% - Funding 50%                    | \$50                          | \$150                           |
| Fee 0% - Funding 100%                    | \$0                           | \$0                             |

Note: An additional fee of \$0, \$50 or \$100 per hour will be charged (based on the fee option chosen) for 5 to 10% site inspections within a blanket permit.

#### **Stakeholder Feedback**

- Concerned about whether the City has enough resources to implement this.
- Positive about the integration of different permit processes.
- Would like to see ongoing monitoring and data sharing as well continued focus on education.
- Utility and telecom companies want more blanket permits but environmental groups questioned accountability around blanket permits.



# **Next Steps**

- Based on cost recovery ratio, Administration may return to Council with a funding request as part of fall SOBA
- Set up the online application process
- Continue working with stakeholders to streamline process
- Create educational material and templates
- Develop marketing and communications strategy for public education
