

Gifts and Honoraria for Council Policy

Repeal of City Policy 563

Recommendation

That City Policy 563, Gifts and Honoraria to Council Members, as set out in Attachment 1 of the August 21, 2018, Office of the City Manager report CR_6226, be repealed.

Executive Summary

This report requests that City Policy 563, Gifts and Honoraria to Council Members, be repealed, as it has been replaced by *Part L: Gifts and Benefits*, in the Council Code of Conduct (Bylaw 18483), approved at the June 26/27, 2018, City Council meeting.

Report

City Policy 563, Gifts and Honoraria to Council Members, set out in Attachment 1 of the July 10, 2018, Office of the City Manager report CR_6226, was adopted by City Council on November 9, 2011, to establish managing gifts and honoraria received in the course of fulfilling their duties as elected officials.

Effective June 26, 2018, Bylaw 18483 established the Council Code of Conduct, which contains a section to guide acceptance and disclosure of gifts and benefits for Members of Council. Therefore, City Policy 563 is no longer relevant and should be repealed.
