Sample Homeowners Enhanced Maintenance Guidelines and Responsibilities Schedule C

Trees

Deep Root Watering

- Must be at a very low-pressure level. Surface watering is as important as deep root watering.
- Soil replacement, as needed. Replacement soil must meet the Design and Construction Standards (Volume 5 Landscaping) for quality and weed-free status, and proof of weed-free status may be required.
- Any stockpiling of soil must meet the requirements in the Contractor's Environmental Responsibility Package, and depending on volumes can include
 - o ensuring the pile is stable and not stored on a steep slope
 - o located away from catch basins and water bodies
 - o controlling weeds, protecting from wind and rain
- Shredded wood mulch replacement (no rock or shale mulch is authorized), as needed
- Mulch specifications
- Please call 311 to request Tree pruning

Shrubs

- Shrub Pruning, as needed.
- As needed shrub planting (replacement planting only), please call 311 to assess the appropriateness of shrubs.
- The Homeowner's Association is responsible for all maintenance regarding establishing newly planted inventory, such as watering, monitoring and subsequent replacements. Refer to the City of Edmonton Volume 5 Landscape Design and Construction Standards for planting specifications.
- Shredded wood mulch replacement (no rock or shale mulch is authorized), as needed
- No work should be done on shrubs in natural areas or river valley/ravine areas.

Flower beds

- Manual weeding, by hand, as needed. (no herbicides, pesticides, or other chemicals are authorized).
- Install, plant and maintain flower planters only on parkland; (considered as temporary)

Fertilizer, Litter and Dog Bag Stands

• Dog bag stand replacement of bags; Clean up of litter - please call 311 to

- determine type and quantity allowed
- Fertilizing Please call 311 to determine type and quantity allowed

Maintaining Grassed Areas

Notify the City in advance if the Enhanced Maintenance activities will replace the City's scheduled base maintenance.

Naturalized Areas including Stormwater Management Facility

- A number of stormwater management facilities throughout the City will be naturalized; the limits of the naturalized areas will be signed and should not be moved.
- Mowing by the Homeowner's Association would not be permitted within the naturalized areas, in accordance with the City of Edmonton's landscape standards for stormwater management facilities.
 - Additional mowing and trimming on mowed buffers and ornamental seating areas and viewpoints is something that can be done by the Homeowner's Association
- Weed control
 - Mechanical weed removal (hand pulling and "weed wacking")
 - Pesticides and herbicides are not permitted to be used
- Horticulture
 - Enhanced shrub bed maintenance in maintained shrub beds outside of on ornamental shrub beds surrounding the naturalized areas
 - o Shrub beds within naturalized areas will be naturalized
 - Mulch should not be topped up in naturalized areas
- Tree and Shrub Pruning and Planting
