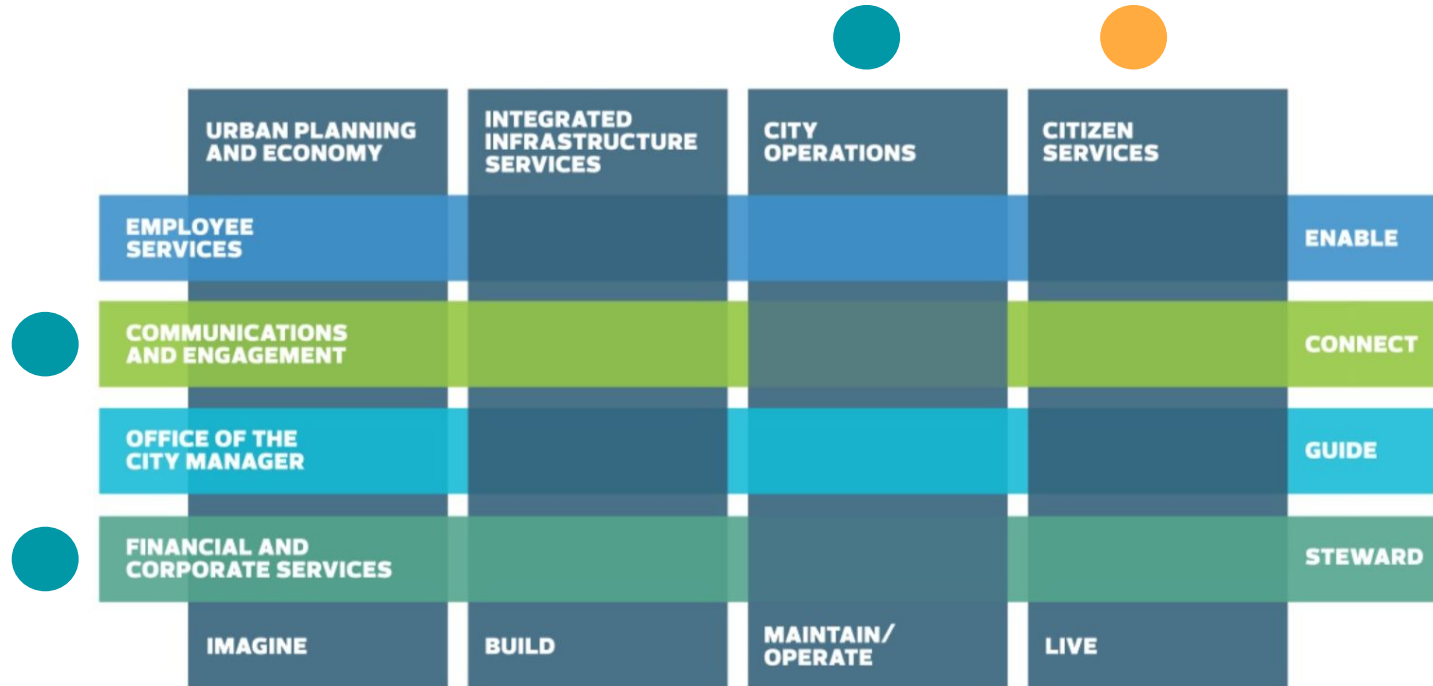

- Activate Emergency Operations Centre as required for events

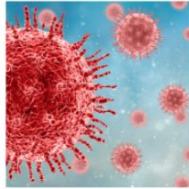
Foundational Documents

- **Municipal Emergency Plan**

Office Emergency Management (OEM)



- Provides information to Emergency Advisory Committee
 - *Includes Mayor and Council*
- Emergency Operations Centre
- Emergency Management Agency
- Emergency Support Response Team
- Business Continuity Management

EAC Roles/Responsibilities

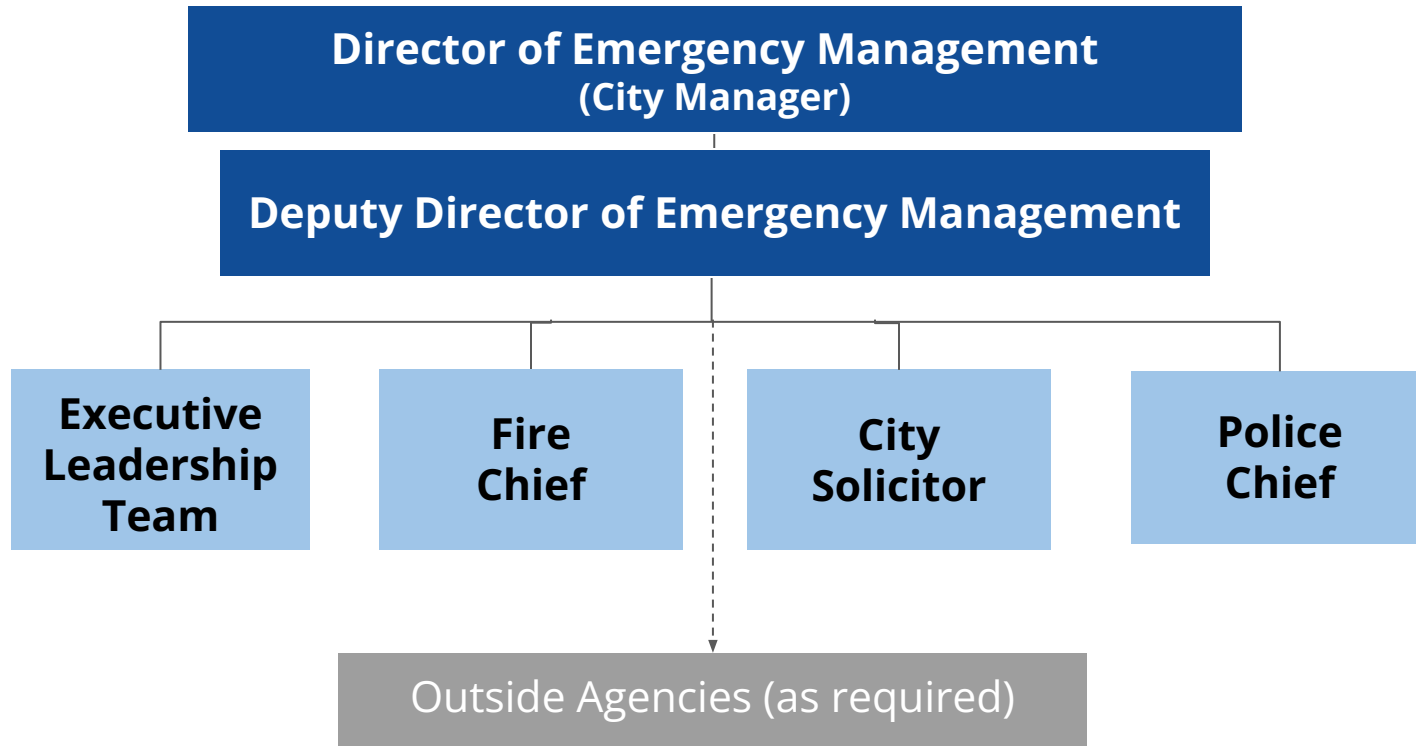
In a regular meeting:

- Receive program updates
- Provide guidance and direction
- Approve emergency plans and programs
- Participate in prescribed training and exercises
- Awareness of need for a special meeting of the Advisory Committee

In a special meeting:

- **Declare, renew, or terminate a State of Local Emergency**
- Receive updates from Emergency Management Agency
- External communications aligned with official messaging

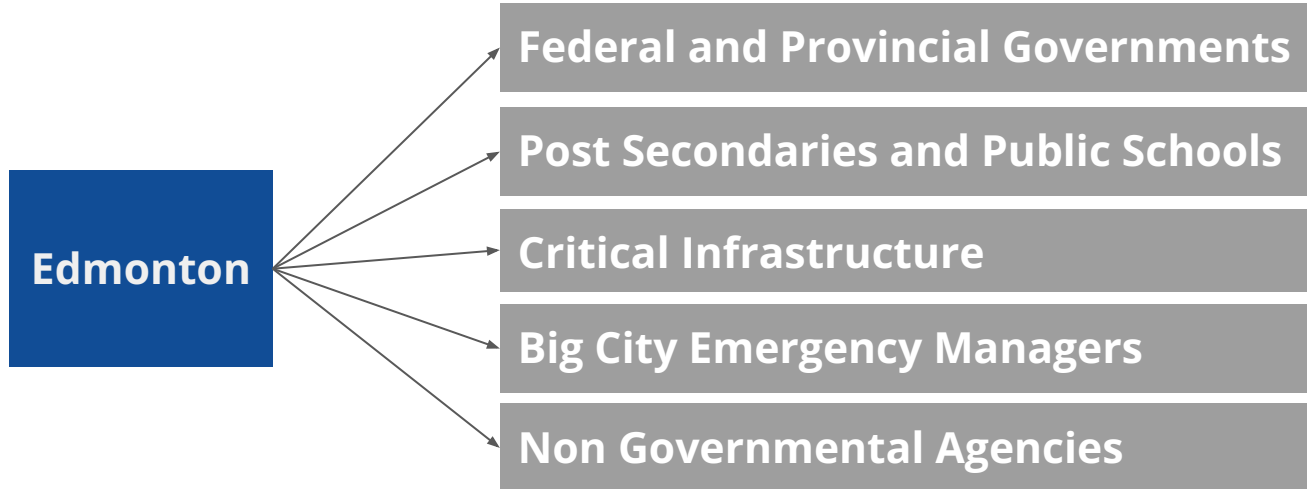

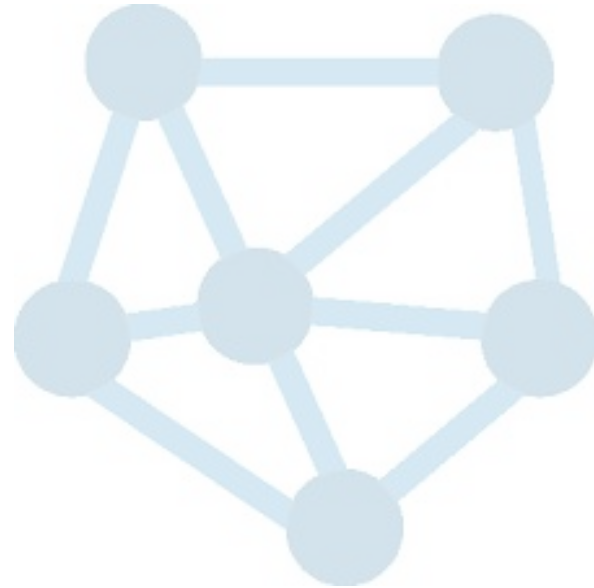
Additional Programs & Services
