## **City Funded Day Services 2021**

Based on the work done to date, a summary of services and outputs is provided below.

## **Bissell Centre Community Space**

- Operate Monday to Saturday from 7:00 am to 9:00 pm; Sunday from 12:00 pm to 7:00 pm
- Accommodate between 35-50 people depending on public health orders
- Essential basic needs services provided daily include three meals and beverage service, showers, laundry, clothing and hygiene items, and harm reduction supplies
- Support services include cultural, housing, financial empowerment, medical, and mental health and addictions

## **Boyle Street Community Services**

- Operate Monday to Friday 8:00 am to 4:30 pm; Saturday and Sunday 8:30 am to 4:30 pm
- Accommodate 45 people in their building and an additional 45-60 people in the exterior of the building
- Essential basic needs services provided daily include lunch and beverage service, clothing and hygiene items, and harm reduction supplies
- Support services include housing, medical, mental health and addictions, and youth and family
- Bus service operates seven days per week to provide essential supplies (food, clothing, hygiene, overdose prevention supplies), transportation amongst day and overnight shelters and appointments, and referrals to critical supports

#### The Mustard Seed 96 St Church

- Operate seven days a week from 9:00 am to 10:00 pm
- Accommodate between 28-65 people depending on public health orders
- Essential basic needs services provided daily include two meals, beverage service, clothing and hygiene items, and harm reduction supplies
- Support services include housing, financial empowerment, and employment

## **Hope Mission Patio Project**

- Animated the exterior of Hope Mission seven days a week from 8:30 am-6:00 pm
- Accommodate 45-60 people in the exterior of the building with additional infrastructure for people to gather outside
- Basic needs services available meals and beverage service, and clothing and hygiene items
- Support services include housing and medical

# Boyle Street Community Services and Boyle McCauley Health Centre - Overdose Prevention and Response

- Mobile overdose prevention teams made up of nursing staff and an outreach team member patrolled the downtown area on bikes to check on community members at risk of overdose/drug poisoning
  - providing a person-centred and trauma-informed response to current overdose issues. In doing their daily rounds, they engaged in community connections with the intent to educate people about overdose/poisoning prevention and response, distribute naloxone kits, and refer people to available supervised consumption facilities. They also provided information on available opioid agonist treatment programs and facilitated appointments.
- Primary goals were to prevent and respond to drug poisoning/accidental overdose fatalities. The outreach team includes a medical practitioner and client support worker that have engaged with individuals within the vicinity of the Boyle McCauley Health Centre.
  - The service included the provision of naloxone (and education on its use), conducting health promotion activities and linking clients to appropriate resources.

### **Additional Services**

- Borden Park public washroom attendants
- Five fire hydrants were modified to become public water stations as part of an innovative pilot project
- A laundry inclusion pilot project created access to free laundry for people staying at emergency shelters through funding a partnership with a private laundry location
