





Background

- Edmonton Cenotaph originally built in 1936 near the Edmonton Journal building; relocated to current site in 1978
- Heritage Value:
 - Significant as a commemorative structure paying tribute to Edmontonians who gave their lives in global conflicts
 - Significant as an example of classical cenotaph design
- Restoration work was concluded in the spring of 2021, and involved a full cleaning of the structure, and minor repairs
- Rehabilitation costs were addressed through internal budgets, and no funding from the Heritage Resources Reserve was required
