

New Historic Resource Management Plan

- → 18 month process (2023-2024)
- → Best practices, determination of community values, assessment of heritage ecosystem, policy development & stakeholder and public engagement
- **→** \$420,000
- → One additional FTE also required



Glenora Heritage Character Area Rezoning

- → Project began in 2019 at direction of Council
- → Goal to maintain heritage character of area while allowing for complementary changes
- → June 2021 UPC direction: pause project and prepare report about resources needed for new city-wide heritage strategy
- → Pause will continue while new Historic Resource Management Plan is prepared



Recommendation:

"That Administration prepare an unfunded service package for consideration as part of the 2023-2026 budget process to fund preparation of a new Historic Resource Management Plan as outlined in Attachment 2 of the January 18, 2022, Urban Planning and Economy report UPE00724"
