


Why District Planning?

Why District Planning?





Project Scope

- Gather general policies that apply to all districts
- Establish 15 district plans
- Focus on **growth to 1.25 million** people
- Repeal existing plans that are complete

District General Policy

- The City Plan is the starting point
- **Drawing from existing sources** e.g. *Transit Oriented Development Guidelines, Residential Infill Guidelines*
- Leveraging existing, approved and relevant policies

District Plans


- Applies The City Plan's directions at the district level
- Illustrates, through its maps, **how the district will change** (as per *The City Plan*)
- Will contain **policy exceptions** that are **specific to that district**

District Planning Engagement - Considerations

- Committed to engaging with residents, leagues, industry, businesses, institutions, partner organizations
- Equity measures
- Will be clear about the level of engagement, the input needed and how it will be used
- District Planning is different from creating other types of plans



District Planning Engagement - 3 Parts

Part 1: Awareness & Pre-Engagement Communication (Spring 2022)

• Share info about the project, its connection to The City Plan

Part 2: Engagement - Refine (Summer to Fall 2022)

 Input will help refine the drafts of the District General Policy and district plans

Part 3: Engagement - Advise (2023)

 Input will help finalize drafts of the District General Policy and District Plans
