

How We Got Here



Suspended Funding Formula - Policy C604

Operating Budget Amount =

Base Budget * (1+ Population Change % + Police Price Index % - Efficiency Factor %)

- Base budget = prior year net operating requirement + transfer from Traffic Safety & Automated Enforcement Reserve
- Population Change annual change in population (statistics driven)
- Police Price Index annual inflation for police operating expenses (statistics driven)
- Efficiency Factor annual reduction to EPS operating budget for efficiencies (Council Decision)

Policing - Roles & Responsibilities



- Establishment of Commission/appointment of members
- Approve total amount of EPS operating funding
- Ratify the appointment of the Chief of Police

- Prepare overall budget request in consultation with Chief of Police
- Recruit and provide direction to the Chief of Police
- Allocation of Council approved funding based on priorities
- Carry out policing duties in accordance with EPC oversight

	Align to Existing City Budget Process	Revised Funding Formula (Recommendation)	Interim Approach - Freeze or Deduction
Potential Benefits	+ Familiar + Transparency + Opportunity for annual adjustments	+ Stable & predictable + Participation in corporate reductions + EPC manages funds and budget pressures	+ Time to gauge impact & align with CSWB + Minimize current service impacts
Potential Tradeoffs	Overriding role of commissionTime consuming, contentiousLess predictable	- Less transparent - Potential funding inequities with other departments	- Defers funding decision - Potential service impacts

Next Steps

- If recommendation approved:
 - Direction from Council on revisions
 - Proposed funding formula and policy brought back for consideration as a part of the 2023-2026 budget deliberations
- If Council chooses not to implement a funding formula:
 - EPS will complete the 2023-2026 budget following the same process as civic departments
 - Estimated salary settlements will be held corporately
