STRETCH TARGETS

- Less than 35% of average household expenditures spent on housing & transportation

- There is no chronic or episodic homelessness in Edmonton
- Nobody is in core housing need



STRETCH TARGETS

- 50% trips by transit & active transportation

- 15 min districts that allow people to easily complete their daily needs



STRETCH TARGETS

- 50% of new units added through infill city wide

600k additional residents will be welcomed into the redeveloping area



STRETCH TARGETS

- Hold 70% of employment in Edmonton

Nodes and corridors support 50% of all employment in Edmonton

Innovation Corridor attracts 50,000 more jobs



STRETCH TARGETS

- 2m new urban trees planted
- Net per person GHG emissions are nearing zero
