Recommendation: Enhance Evaluation Criteria

- → Include Indigenous content criteria
 - Contractors
 - Subcontractors
- Indigenous employment/apprenticeships and/or indeginiuos community social partnership

Recommendation: Mix of Procurement Opportunities

- → Span dollar values
- → Capacity variation across all price points and industry

Recommendation: Set Asides

- → Cultural Observances are of utmost importance
- → Culturally significant projects lead by Indigenous businesses

Recommendation: Heritage Verification

- Proof of registration in one of five recognized business associations or registries
- A letter from an Indigenous Nation, Band Council or representative community organization indicating membership in the Nation, Band or community

Recommendation: Communication

- → Normalize inclusion
- → Key points of education
- → Ongoing engagement with the business community

Recommendation: Networking

- → Partner with established business communities
- → Engage with the full supplier community
- → Update 'Selling to the City'
