

## Community Safety & Well-Being Strategy - City Actions

The Community Safety & Well-Being Strategy is a roadmap for inclusive, connected and coordinated safety and well-being planning that is aligned to the values in The City Plan. Its success is a shared responsibility amongst all Edmontonians and City partners. The success of the Strategy is contingent on Administration's efforts, both new and existing, that address identified gaps in service that have arisen due to emergent needs in the sector.

Ongoing work of the City serves as a necessary foundation for Community Safety and Well Being, such as affordable housing, homelessness prevention and intervention, while new work complements and supports the Strategy. This work includes, but is not limited to, the Indigenous Framework, Urban Reserve Strategy, Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action and Anti-Racism Strategy. The City has also collaborated with partners to address emergent needs in which the City has not historically been involved in, such as emergency shelter operations and extended shelter day-services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Recent actions funded by Council as part of OCM00991 Community Safety and Well-Being Strategy, approved on May 16/17, 2022 and various additional motions to fund other supporting actions are listed in the table below.
