- Enabling regional mobility supports a globally competitive Edmonton Metropolitan region.
- Shared regional investments include:
 - U-Pass agreement
 - Integrated trip planning, Smart Bus technology
 - Access agreements
 - Regional service delivery from ETS
 - Regional faring Arc, regional fare capping
 - Support for the Edmonton Metropolitan Transit
 Services Commission ("the Commission" hereafter)





ETS Transit Network Context

- **Regional Transit** Phase One Service Plan.
- Transit Network Equity Analysis will guide future enhancements to network Council report in October 2022.
- On Demand Transit funding ends in April 2023; evaluation of service delivery model underway - Council report in October 2022, prior to Budget.



| February 2020 | 8 municipalities vote to create a Regional Transit Services Commission |
| June 2020 | Addendum to business case |
| February 2021 | The Commission is formally established |
