- ▶ City Administration advocates an option that
 - ▶ is less safe
 - ▶ is costlier
 - ▶ does not meet standards
- ▶ Council must refer the application back

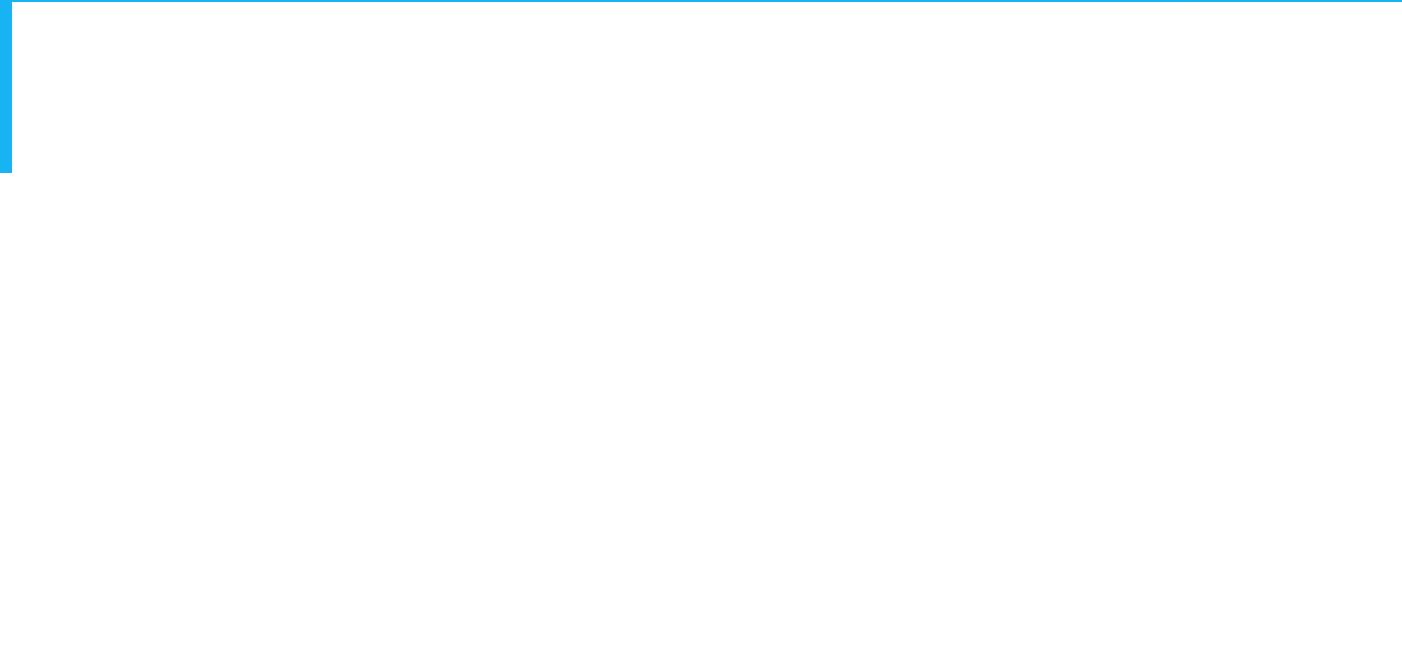
