  - Public Places Bylaw

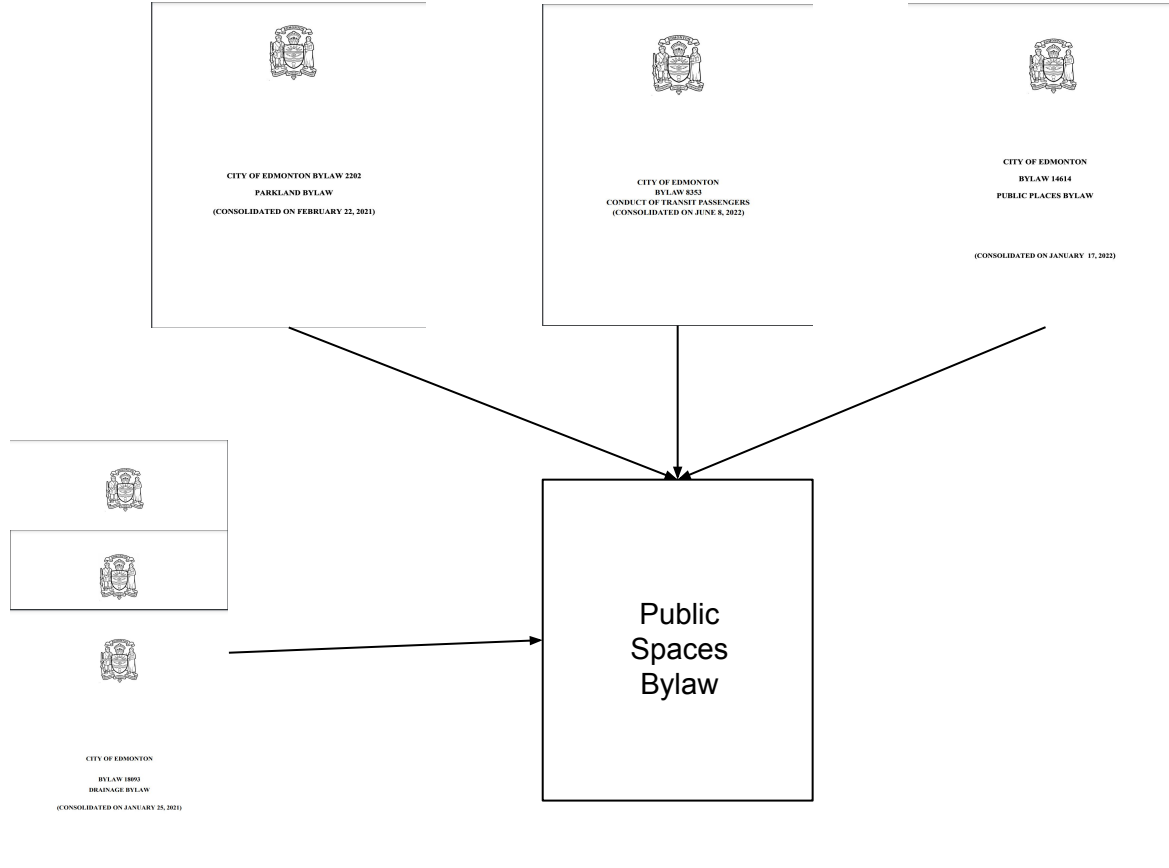
- Traffic Bylaw (yellow)

## What We've Heard

- Public space regulation is a balance between safety for the public and our employees, equity, and appropriate use
- Council direction to reduce discretionary interpretation and promote consistency and clarity
- GBA+ and accessibility must inform every decision

# Where We Are Going



## In Scope vs Out of Scope

- In scope:
  - Parkland Bylaw
  - Conduct of Transit Passengers Bylaw
  - Public Places Bylaw
  - Other bylaw provisions that regulate public spaces
- Out of scope:
  - Private property requirements
  - Motor vehicle behaviours

## Decision-making Process

- Jurisdictional scan
- Categorize
  - Rules that don't need to change
  - Rules that need refinement
  - Rules that need significant public input
- Community and employee engagement
- Draft bylaw

## Next Steps

- Jurisdictional scan completed Q4 2022
- Engagement Q1/Q2 2023
- Bylaw Drafting Q2 2023
- Council Consideration Q3 2023
