Lessons Learned from the 2021 Edmonton Election


Better alignment between municipal and school division Ward boundaries would:

- improve the voting process
- reduce the number of ballot styles



Potential Adjustment 1: Calgary Trail South Neighbourhood from Ward Karhiio to Ward papastew


- No impact on eligible electors
- Minimal impact on population (11 residents)
- Involves small parcel of non-residential land (0.65km²)





Potential Adjustment 2: Yellowhead Corridor West Neighbourhood from Ward Anirniq into Ward O-day'min

- No impact on eligible electors
- No impact on population
- Involves small parcel of non-residential land (1.16km²)

Next Steps

- If Executive Committee recommends first reading of Bylaw 20304 to Council (subject to any amendments from Executive Committee)
- First reading of Bylaw 20304 by Council
- Two week advertising period, followed by a 60-day receipt of petition window
- Second and Third readings of Bylaw 20304 by Council
- Amended Ward boundaries come into effect on Election Day of the 2025 Edmonton Election (Monday, October 20 2025)
