Funding Agreement Amendment

Recommendation:

That Community and Public Services Committee recommend to City Council:

That an amendment to the funding agreement between the City of Edmonton and the Edmonton Space and Science Foundation, as outlined in the July 6, 2017, Citizen Services report CR_4902, be approved, and that the amendment be in form and content acceptable, to the City Manager.

Report Summary

This report addresses the requirement to amend the existing funding agreement with the Edmonton Space and Science Foundation to continue the development of the TELUS World of Science - Edmonton Phase 2a: The Aurora Initiative, specifically the refurbishment of Margaret Zeidler Star Theatre and the Space Gallery.

Report

Background

The Telus World of Science - Edmonton's Aurora Project, Phase 2a of their 2009 Master Plan, adds approximately 28,000 square feet to the facility. A new Arctic Gallery and Entry Portal will be created and three existing spaces will be renewed:

- the Margaret Zeidler Star Theatre (the North Dome)
- the Hole and Allard Gallery (the Science Galleries)
- the Space Place Galleries (Early Childhood Education Centre)

As part of the 2015-2018 capital budget, City Council approved \$12 million towards the \$40 million project. In April 2015, City Council approved the execution of the funding agreement between the City of Edmonton and the Edmonton Space and Science Foundation.

In accordance with the funding agreement, the City released \$4 million to the foundation in December 2015 following City approval of their updated business case for the Aurora Project. These funds were used to complete the renewal of the Cafe, as well as to complete the detailed design of the expansion portion of the project.

As outlined in the funding agreement, the remaining \$8 million of City funding is to be released upon confirmation that the foundation has secured the remaining \$28 million required to complete the project.

Project Update

The Edmonton Space and Science Foundation is continuing its efforts to secure the remaining \$28 million. To date, the foundation has secured \$4.5 million.

- The federal government's Cultural Spaces Fund has committed \$3.35 million towards the Aurora Project, specifically the refurbishment of the Margaret Zeidler Star Theatre and the Space Gallery, which has an estimated cost of \$8 million.
- A local family has committed a \$1 million philanthropic gift towards the project.
- A community campaign has raised approximately \$150,000.

TELUS World of Science - Edmonton has been identified in the Government of Alberta's Capital Plan at \$12 million; although currently unfunded.

Next Steps

The Edmonton Space and Science Foundation has requested that the City release \$5 million of the remaining \$8 million capital funding to complete the refurbishment of the Margaret Zeidler Star Theatre and the Space Gallery. This, combined with the secured federal and private donor capital, will fully fund the refurbishment.

The redevelopment in existing neighbourhoods continually improves Edmonton as a place where people want to live, work and play.

Public Engagement

TELUS World of Science - Edmonton worked through an extensive public consultation plan for 2008-2020, which was initiated with the unveiling of its master plan in 2008. Through the consultation process over the last few years, community input has resulted in accommodation for phasing, neighbourhood design revisions, alignment with the City's The Way Ahead, and other adaptations. Ongoing implementation of the public consultation plan will ensure engagement of the community throughout the project.

Budget/Financial Implications

As part of the 2015-2018 capital budget, capital profile 15-21-6600 Telus World of Science was approved, in the amount of \$40 million, with \$12 million from Pay-as-You-Go, \$20 million from other orders of government and \$8 million from other partners.

Legal Implications

If the funding agreement is amended in accordance with this report, Administration will have the ability to advance \$5 million dollars of the remaining \$8 million dollars in approved funding prior to the foundation having secured all necessary funding to complete the project.
