

# Bylaw 17977

## 2017 Repealing Bylaw

---

### Purpose

To approve the repeal of, and corrections to, City bylaws.

### Readings

Bylaw 17977 is ready for three readings.

If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, then prior to moving third reading, Council must unanimously agree “That Bylaw 17977 be considered for third reading.”

### Advertising and Signing

Advertising is not required for this Bylaw.

### Position of Administration

Administration supports this Bylaw.

### Report Summary

A Repealing Bylaw is presented to Council annually to ensure that expired bylaws are repealed and to correct typographical errors in already passed bylaws.

### Report

The Office of the City Clerk and Law undertake an annual review of current City bylaws. The review consists of ensuring that expired bylaws are repealed and minor typographical changes are adopted in accordance with the *Municipal Government Act*. The Schedules to the Repealing Bylaw identify the list of bylaws that are proposed to be repealed and a list of corrections for adoption by Council.

Schedule A lists bylaws to be repealed.

Schedule B lists bylaws to be corrected.

### Corporate Outcomes

The proposed bylaw supports the strategic goal of having a well-managed City by ensuring that the City’s legislative instruments are up to date and necessarily required to fulfill Council’s vision.

### Legal Implications

Sections 63 to 69 of the *Municipal Government Act* allow Council to, by bylaw, adopt corrections to bylaws. The power to correct bylaws for minor errors has been delegated to the City Manager through the City Administration Bylaw 16620. Corrected bylaws are corrected from the date of passage, once the corrections are adopted by Council.
