Introduction

- Annual update to Council to comply with Emergency Management Bylaw 19091
- Mayor is Chair of EAC, Councillors are members
- EAC functions to:
 - Provide guidance and direction to the Emergency Management Agency, including approving the City's Emergency Plan
 - Declare a state of local emergency and exercise any of Council's powers and duties under the Emergency Management Act



COVID-19 Update

- Continuing to monitor employee COVID-19 cases and make adjustments to CoE workplace controls as necessary.
 - Booster shots being encouraged as well as flu immunizations.



Ukraine Update

- Displaced Ukrainians have been arriving in Edmonton since March 28, 2022
- Charter flights have been utilized to move people to Edmonton and return to Ukraine with critical supplies
- From March to October, there have been approximately 10,000 displaced Ukrainians brought to Alberta. On average, this number increases by 500/week.



Office of Emergency Management 2022 Update

- Year To Date: 16 EOC activations
- Emergency Support Response Team responses:
