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Advocacy

The TRC Calls to Action call on everyone to advocate for reconciliation. The <u>Indigenous Framework</u> also calls upon City employees to be advocates, to use the power and privilege we possess, the learning and growth we obtain, and our relationships to advocate to other governments, organizations, businesses and education institutions for the necessary changes that will create an inclusive city.

In the course of its intergovernmental work, the City of Edmonton can respond to this call by creating spaces for discussion of the issues raised by the TRC. Whenever appropriate, leaders are encouraged to ask about reconciliation in their interactions with other governments and governmental associations — this is also prompted in formal materials prepared for Council by Intergovernmental Affairs. Open, collaborative and relationship-focused discussions might sound like, "As part of the City of Edmonton's commitment to reconciliation, are there ways that our work on [policy issue] can advance the calls to action of the TRC, the principles of the UNDRIP, or the recommendations of the National Inquiry into MMIWG2S+? Are there ways the City of Edmonton can help advance this work in our city?" With Canada's second largest urban Indigenous population, the City of Edmonton is volunteering the community to pilot any new reconciliation-related programs contemplated by the provincial and federal governments.

Should there be appetite for detailed discussion, Administration can prepare further advice on advancing collaborative discussions, taking into account the current environment and various parties' efforts to advance the work recommended by the TRC.
