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Executive Summary

- This report requests approval of the 2023 Boards of Directors for the 13 Business Improvement Area (BIA) associations.
- Individuals are eligible to be directors on a Business Improvement Area association board if they have been nominated by a tax-levy paying business member of the association and have consented to be a director.

REPORT

A business improvement area (BIA) is a defined geographic area in which businesses combine resources and work together through a formal association of business members to enhance the economic development of their area. Edmonton's 13 BIA associations and their board members are critical partners in achieving the City's strategic goal of Regional Prosperity and the ongoing development of Edmonton's economic strategy, the Economic Action Plan.

A BIA and its related association is created by City bylaw, and each BIA has its own bylaw. Each year, City Council must review nominations and appoint individuals to serve as directors on the boards of these associations. This requirement is pursuant to the provincial *Municipal Government Act* (RSA 2000, c M-26), *Business Improvement Area Regulation* (Alberta Regulation 93/2016) and the City's BIA bylaws.

Individuals are eligible to be directors on a BIA association board if they have been nominated by a tax-levy paying member of the BIA and have consented to act as a director. All 13 BIA associations have completed their required annual general meetings (AGMs), which included soliciting nominations to their boards, reviewing nominations and selecting recommended candidates. In accordance with each individual BIA bylaw, all recommended board candidates have accepted their nomination to stand for appointment. Each BIA may have up to 15 directors on their board.

COMMUNITY INSIGHT

In September and October each year, Edmonton's 13 Business Improvement Areas hold their AGMs where BIA members are invited to participate and vote on the composition of their Board of Directors for the coming year. All 13 board member lists presented to City Council with this report (Attachment 1) were voted on and approved by the membership in attendance for the AGMs, according to provincial and municipal processes and regulations.

GBA+

BIA administrators (i.e. Executive Directors and boards) recognize the importance of anticipating the needs of equity seeking groups and business owners. Administration is working to develop resources for partner organizations to help them to learn about and apply an equity lens on the planning and execution of BIA initiatives. Integrating GBA+ processes can help ensure that the work and budget allocation contributes to the accessibility and equity of BIA services.

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While BIAs are independent entities with their own procedures and operating guidelines, City Administration will:

- Periodically review the bylaws, policies and procedures that govern BIA's to ensure they require a GBA+ process in board recruitment and selection processes.
- Collaborate with all 13 BIA association administrators to ensure they have the support to understand, appreciate and apply a high quality GBA+ process in the formation and recruitment of potential board members as well as in regular business planning.
