Bylaw 18483 - Code of Conduct Revision Proposed Work Plan

Draft Approach

Purpose

Bylaw 18156 - Council Committees Bylaw establishes the Code of Conduct Sub-Committee as a temporary sub-committee of the Council Services Committee. Its mandate is to "review the Council Code of Conduct Bylaw, Bylaw 18483, and provide recommendations for changes; and any other matters referred to it by Council."

The purpose of this draft work plan is to propose a process that the Code of Conduct Sub-Committee could adopt to fulfill its mandate and produce proposed revisions to Bylaw 18483 - Council Code of Conduct for Council Services Committee consideration by the end of 2023 calendar year.

Scope

Since its creation, Bylaw 18483 - Council Code of Conduct has been reviewed and expanded on several occasions to improve its clarity.

The scope of this draft work plan focuses on outlining a process for Councillors to provide input in changes of its Code of Conduct. There are four meetings scheduled in 2023. It is proposed that at each meeting Committee work through the topics listed below in order. It will get through as much as it can each meeting then at the next meeting, Administration will return with a summary of what it heard and the Committee will resume at the next point on the list and will continue until all sections have been reviewed.
