Bylaw 20374: Amendments to Bylaw 20002 - Designated Driver Service Updates

Urban Planning Committee March 21, 2023

Omnibus Amendment to Business Licence Bylaw 20002 (Bylaw 20367):

- 1. Reducing the amount of personal information businesses must collect for adult service workers
- 2. Updating business licence category descriptions
- 3. Extending Administration's discretionary powers to waive minimum holding requirements for goods sold on consignment
- 4. Enhancing and clarifying compliance tools and fines relating to the automatic suspension and business licence review provisions
- 5. Minor corrections for clarity and consistency

Designated Driver Service Updates (Bylaw 20374):

- New *Designated Driver Service* business licence category
- Businesses must obtain a police information check from anyone employed, or being considered for employment as a designated driver
- Businesses cannot employ drivers with convictions for violent or sexual crimes, trafficking, fraud, or unlawful operation of a motor vehicle within the previous 10 years
- Businesses must obtain updated police information checks every six months from drivers with current charges
