Background

- December 15, 2022: *Police Amendment Act, 2022* received Royal Assent.
- March 29, 2023, amendments to Section 28, Commissions proclaimed.
 - The Minister may now make appointments to the Edmonton Police Commission.
- Changes:
 - A limit to the number of Council-appointed members.
 - The addition of Minister-appointed members.

Police Act Changes - Minister-Appointed Members

- *Council may appoint up to 9 members.*
- If Council appoints 9, the Minister may appoint up to 3, for a total of 12. The Minister may appoint more than 3; total number cannot exceed 15.
 - Terms of up to 3 years.
 - Only be revoked by the Minister.

Minister-appointed members	3	3

Routing

- Membership-related Council reports are routed depending on where recommendations are made.
- For the Edmonton Police Commission, City Council is the appointment body.
