## **Reviewing the election timeline**

Alberta has a fixed election date. The next Provincial General Election is scheduled to be held on May 29, 2023.

April - Pre-election positioning

May 1 - Writs of Election issued (aka Writ drop)

May 11 - Nomination day (Nominations close at 2pm)

May 23 to May 27 - Advance voting

**May 29** - Election Day (Unofficial results will be reported after the close of voting)

June 8 - Announcement of Official Results (allows time for recounts, etc.)

## **Direct Communication from Council to Candidates**

- Leveraging Council's channels, a direct non-partisan communication will be issued to all declared candidates emphasizing City Council's longstanding requests to the incoming government
- Priorities are themed as follows:
  - Economic revitalization and growth
  - Energy transition and climate resilience
  - Housing, affordability and community wellbeing
  - Equitable support for Edmonton and Calgary
- Full details are provided in Attachment 1; however, numbers and wording should be considered **draft** Council is requested to provide feedback on the use of this tactic

## If desired, a draft motion for Council

That the Mayor, on behalf of City Council, write a letter to all declared provincial government candidates emphasizing the City of Edmonton's advocacy priorities of Economic Revitalization and Growth, Energy Transition and Climate Resilience, Housing, Affordability, and Community Wellbeing and Equitable Support for Edmonton and Calgary.
