The scope of work has been updated to be in alignment with the Safe Mobility Strategy. This new Safe Crossings program will expand the measures available through the current crosswalks program to include options ranging from temporary curb extensions to new signalization options (i.e., scramble crosswalks and lead pedestrian intervals) to rapid flashing beacons and pedestrian and full signals. By considering a wide variety of tools and controls, the Safe Crossings program will improve safety for all through protecting vulnerable road users.
