Engagement

IDEA's members have participated in the engagement process since 2018:

- Phase 1 workshops, surveys, and other forms of public engagement
- Phase 2 and 3 online public engagement, chats with planners, letter writing, comments on the City's online feedback tool, zone testing, and other City-hosted presentations



Infill and City Plan

- CITY PLAN sets the vision for sustainable growth as Edmonton reaches two million people
- INFILL DEVELOPMENT helps realize the vision of City Plan





Efficient Land Use

- Maximizes use of existing infrastructure (roads, utilities, public transportation)
- Key strategy to reduce urban sprawl and preserve green spaces

Revitalization of Neighbourhoods

- Brings new life to older or neglected neighbourhoods
- Attracts residents, businesses, and economic investment



Increased Housing Supply

Diversity of housing type encourages diversity of residents

Sustainability

- Utilizes existing infrastructure and promotes other means of transportation
- Reduces car dependency and greenhouse gas emissions
- Medium and large scale densification is City's Plans "preferred scenario" for enabling the reduction of GHG emissions city-wide



Summary

- Proposed zoning bylaw WILL make infill development easier
- Proposed zoning bylaw as it stands WON'T get us to 50%, but is a step in the right direction
- District Pans and ARP Repeals provide further direction
