COUNCIL REPORT – BYLAW

Edmonton

BYLAW 20599

To amend Bylaw 17497, to authorize the City of Edmonton to undertake, construct and finance Waste Management Services Project, Equipment Acquisition (P&D)

Recommendation

That Bylaw 20599 be given the appropriate readings.

Purpose

To amend Bylaw 17497, to decrease the borrowing authority by \$6.79 million from \$11.86 million to \$5.07 million.

Readings

Bylaw 20599 is ready for three readings.

A majority vote of City Council on all three readings is required for passage.

If Council wishes to give three readings during a single meeting, then prior to moving third reading, Council must unanimously agree "That Bylaw 20599 be considered for third reading."

Advertising and Signing

This Bylaw does not require advertising and the Bylaw can be signed and thereby passed following third reading.

Under section 258(5) of the *Municipal Government Act*, a borrowing bylaw does not need to be advertised unless there is an increased cost of more than 15 per cent of the original cost of the capital property.

REPORT

The history of the borrowing bylaw is as follows:

• At the January 26, 2016, City Council meeting, Bylaw 17497 was passed.

BYLAW 20599 - To amend Bylaw 17497, to authorize the City of Edmonton to undertake, construct and finance Waste Management Services Project, Equipment Acquisition (P&D)

Project CM-33-2009 Equipment Acquisition (P&D) was originally budgeted to cost \$11.86 million with \$11.86 million of self-liquidating debt as a financing source. Accordingly, a total of \$11.86 million was originally planned to be borrowed under Bylaw 17497 for this project.

This project is now completed with actual spending of \$10.52 million funded through self-liquidated debt of \$5.07 million and \$5.45 million in Retained Earnings. Less than budgeted debt was used to fund project expenditures as certain expenditures were not eligible for debt financing. As a result, this bylaw amendment will decrease the borrowing authority from the \$11.86 million budgeted to \$5.07 million borrowed. No further borrowing is required on this bylaw.

Community Insight

Borrowing bylaws reflect a legislative requirement of the borrowing process. As a result, no community insight is undertaken with respect to the borrowing bylaw process. Where required by the *Municipal Government Act*, borrowing bylaws are advertised.
