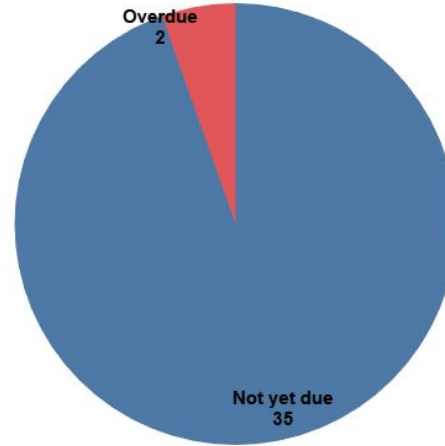
Years since recommendation was made

7.3 - Valley Line LRT P3 Delivery

Audit Area	Key Finding
P3 Procurement	The City procured private partners for each Valley Line LRT project in a fair, open, and transparent manner.
Project Agreement Design	Project agreements for the Valley Line Southeast and West clearly allocated risks, protected the City's interests, and set out requirements for communication.
Project Agreement Management	The City is holding the private partner accountable for achieving cost effective and service delivery expectations of the Valley Line Southeast infrastructure, in compliance with the project agreement.

7.5 - Capital Asset Management

7.5 - Capital Asset Management

Positive Findings

- The City has improved the average condition of its existing infrastructure since 2010.
- The City has an Infrastructure Asset Management Policy, Strategy and Asset Management Plans for some of its significant assets.

Recommendations

1. Update the Infrastructure Asset Management Policy and the Infrastructure Strategy.
2. Guide the development, approval, and regular updates of Asset Management Plans for significant asset categories.
3. Develop guidance on asset disposition including regular asset portfolio reviews.
4. Develop and communicate guidance for asset managers on the requirements of accurate and complete data.
5. Improve the City's capital asset management performance measurement.

7.7 - IT Asset Management

Positive Findings

- Overall, we found that the Open City and Technology Branch is managing the City's IT assets to optimize the use of resources and safeguard them.

Recommendations

1. Improve its standards and procedures to clearly define roles, responsibilities, and processes for IT asset management.
2. Maintain accurate software license data to efficiently manage inventory.
