




Assessment Criteria 2: Community Partner Input

- Transparency in decision-making
- Non-profit organizational capacity
- Prevention and early intervention
- Collaboration and scale up of partnerships
- Data sharing



Assessment Criteria 3: Spectrum of Action







Add \$2.168 million (one-time) to the current \$500,000 CSWB grant for intervention programs focussed on:

- Poverty
- Safe and Inclusive Spaces
- Crime Prevention and Crisis Intervention and;
- Well-Being.

Result: reduce the impact of social issues after they have occurred or provide supports to lessen the potential for risk and harm being experienced



Add \$1 million (one-time) to FCSS program to increase prevention-focused supports

Result: address risk factors to prevent harm from developing in the first place



Create a \$1.495 million (one-time) collaboration grant line

Result: support the scale up of existing shared service delivery and/ or development of new collaborative approaches



Add \$500,000 (ongoing) to the current \$500,000 Operating Grant for Indigenous-led Organizations

Result: provide more stable operations funding to Indigenous-led Organizations
