EHC's newest program was introduced in 2021. FIRE (Funding Indigenous Resurgence in Edmonton) provides funding assistance to Indigenous (First Nations, Métis, and Inuit) individuals and organizations to support projects telling community stories. As of 2022, each applicant may apply for a grant up to \$10,000.


