EDMONTON TRANSIT SERVICE ADVISORY BOARD BYLAW

Edmonton City Council enacts:

PART I - INTERPRETATION

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| PURPOSE | 1 | The purpose of this bylaw is to establish the Edmonton Transit Service Advisory Board as a council committee, and to establish its membership and mandate. |
| DEFINITIONS | 2 | <p>(1) Unless otherwise specified, words used in this bylaw have the same meaning as defined in the <i>Municipal Government Act</i>, RSA 2000, c M-26.</p> <p>(2) In this bylaw:</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(a) “City” means The City of Edmonton;</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(b) “City Manager” means the chief administrative officer of the City or delegate; and</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(c) “Council” means the City’s council.</p> |

PART II - MANDATE

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| MANDATE | 4 | <p>The mandate of the Edmonton Transit Service Advisory Board will be to provide advice to Council from a stakeholder perspective on issues related to public transit, including:</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(a) ridership;</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(b) mix of vehicles;</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(c) the relationship between City projects and public transit;</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(d) reviewing initiatives of other levels of government, surrounding municipalities, and other local authorities or</p> |
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organizations that could affect public transit;

- (e) repair, maintenance and accessibility issues;
- (f) servicing issues; and
- (g) public transit policies.

FUNCTIONS & AUTHORITIES

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To carry out its mandate, the Edmonton Transit Service Advisory Board may:

- (a) identify and engage stakeholder groups and seek their input into its work;
- (b) conduct research and prepare reports on matters within its mandate;
- (c) examine City information regarding current and, at the City Manager's request and where confidentiality issues permit, proposed public transit facilities and infrastructure, programs, public services, activities and policies, to identify issues falling within its mandate;
- (d) work with the City Manager to develop and maintain a dialogue about matters of concern to stakeholders in relation to public transit; and
- (e) inform Council of initiatives of other levels of government, surrounding municipalities and other local authorities and organizations that could impact public transit.

PART III - MEMBERSHIP

MEMBERSHIP

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- (1) The Edmonton Transit Service Advisory Board will be comprised of up to 12 members appointed by Council.
- (2) The President of the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 569, or delegate, may serve on the Edmonton Transit Service Advisory Board in a liaison capacity.

PART IV - TRANSITION & REPEAL

TRANSITION	7	On the coming into force of this bylaw, members appointed to the Edmonton Transit Service Advisory Board will continue to be members until the expiry of their current term.
REPEAL	8	The Edmonton Transit Service Advisory Board Bylaw 16929, is repealed.
