| <b>MANDATE</b> | 4 | <p>The mandate of the Energy Transition Climate Resilience Committee will be to:</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(a) promote the City’s climate change plans and energy transition strategy to each member’s professional and community networks;</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(b) share with, and receive from the City Manager, information regarding the implementation of the City’s climate change plans and energy transition strategy;</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">(c) provide broad independent advice to Council about the</p> |
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City's climate change plans and energy transition strategy; and

- (d) assist Council in developing performance measures for the City's climate change plans and energy transition strategy.

## **FUNCTIONS & AUTHORITIES**

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To carry out its mandate, the Energy Transition Climate Resilience Committee may:

- (a) receive information from the public and experts regarding all aspects of the City's climate change plans and energy transition strategy;
- (b) conduct independent research to enhance information within the Committee's knowledge and input received from the public and experts;
- (c) work with the City Manager to share information with the City's administrative committees and working groups tasked with implementing the City's climate change plans and energy transition strategy;
- (d) develop reports and working papers to assist Council to:
  - (i) provide oversight to ensure that work on the City's climate change plans and energy transition strategy is streamlined and in keeping with its broad policy goals;
  - (ii) ensure implementation goals and targets are attained; and
  - (iii) create appropriate performance measures.

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The Energy Transition Climate Resilience Committee will be comprised of up to 15 members appointed by Council.

#### **PART IV - TRANSITION & REPEAL**

<b>TRANSITION</b>	7	On the coming into force of this bylaw, members appointed to the Energy Transition Climate Resilience Committee will continue to be members until the expiry of their current term.
<b>REPEAL</b>	8	The Energy Transition Climate Resilience Committee Bylaw, Bylaw 17431, is repealed.
