Unintentional deaths reported, Edmonton: **875** (all substances, April 2022 to July 2023*)

→ 86% (751) involved a non-pharmaceutical opioid

Number of EMS opioid responses, Edmonton: 6600 (April 18, 2022 to October 22, 2023)





This map shows distinct neighbourhoods impacted, not incident counts.







- → Knowledge transfer to inform responses ("time, place, team")




- comprehensive data sharing system for community organizations
