BYLAW 20629
SINGLE-USE ITEM REDUCTION BYLAW 20117 Amendment No. 1

WHEREAS on September 13, 2022 Council passed Bylaw 20117, Single-Use Item Reduction Bylaw, which came into force on July 1, 2023;

AND WHEREAS the Federal *Single-use Plastics Prohibition Regulations* affecting the sale of plastic single-use items came into force on December 31, 2023, affecting Bylaw 20117;

Edmonton City Council enacts:

1. Bylaw 20117, Single-Use Item Reduction Bylaw, is revised by this bylaw as follows.
2. The title of the bylaw is deleted and replaced with “Revised Charter Bylaw 20117, Single-Use Item Reduction Bylaw”.
3. Clause 4(2)(b) is deleted.
4. Section 15 is deleted and replaced with:

EXEMPTIONS

- 15 (1) Despite section 14, a business or event organizer may provide polystyrene foam serviceware to a customer when it is:
- (a) used as primary packaging for food safety or sanitation purposes, which includes packaging for uncooked meat, poultry, seafood, or eggs; or
 - (b) a business or event organizer selling items packaged in prepared food containers that have been filled and sealed by an external supplier prior to arrival at the business premises or the location of an event operated by an event organizer.
- (2) However, the exemption in subsection (1) does not apply to the provision of any polystyrene foam serviceware that is otherwise prohibited by the *Single-use Plastics Prohibition Regulations*, SOR/2022-138

5. Section 16 is deleted.
6. This bylaw comes into force on December 20, 2023.
