Edmonton

Addressing Unsecured, Vacant Properties

- Caused mainly by illegal occupants
- High risk for Edmontonians and firefighters
- Often go unreported for extended periods





The CPST Pilot

Escalating model:

- Board up all accessible openings
- 2. Add perimeter fencing
- 3. Add in-person security every 3 hours
- 4. Add 24 hour security

CPST Pilot By the Numbers

	April 2022 To Sept 2023
Properties reported / investigated (#)	593
Resulted in Orders issued	295
# of properties secured (boarded / fenced)	320
# of properties demolished after CPST interactions / orders	111
# of properties redeveloped after CPST interactions / orders	18
# of properties moved to the next step (progressive escalation)	29

31% Decrease in structural fires (2023 projection for target neighbourhoods)

Next Steps

- At the November 21st, 2023, City Council meeting, Administration committed to:
 - The immediate transition of the CPST pilot to a permanent program at its current service level of two Fire Prevention Officers and one Clerk
 - Using vacancy management in 2024 to fully staff the program by repurposing two FTEs for an additional two Fire Prevention Officers
