- Addressing root causes
- Ongoing partnerships
- Provincial commitments:
  - More Alberta Sheriffs in Edmonton
  - Bill 3: Opioid Damages and Health Care Costs
     Recovery Amendment Act
  - \$21 million additional FCSS funding for 100 community programs and projects
- Federal contributions:
  - Bail reform (Bill C-48), prosecution and recidivism
  - \$4.2 million for crime prevention in Edmonton

- Celebrating Edmonton as a Winter City
- Funding for 27 projects
- Over \$2 million in City, federal, partner and private funding



#### **Areas Related to Transit Safety: Chinatown**

- Chinatown Safety Data Audit
- Chinatown Recovery Fund is fully allocated
  - 70% to safety and security measures
  - Grant report will be completed Q1 2024
- Chinatown Vibrancy Grant
- Chinatown Mural Programs
- Safety walks conducted in Oct and Nov
  - 25 distinct locations visited, 14 reports to 311 submitted
  - Next safety walk to take place mid-January 2024

- Range of demographics and age groups










# **Transit Safety: Service Highlights**

| Metric   | October 1-31,<br>2023 | November 1-21,<br>2023 (3 weeks) |
|--|-----------------------|----------------------------------|
| Non-criminal incidents*  | 2,317                 | 1,555                            |
| Total ridership*   | 5,255,719             | 3,361,275                        |
| Non-criminal incidents % of total rides  | 0.044%                | 0.046%                           |
| Perception of safety % of respondents who felt safe throughout their transit journey | 59%                   | -                                |






# Transit Safety: Dispatched Calls for Service at LRT Stations and Transit Centres by Final Event Type (EPS Data)







# Transit Safety: Average Crime Severity\* by Quarter at LRT Stations and Transit Centres (EPS Data)




**Edmonton**

- Data includes all ETS transit centres and LRT stations, except the Valley Line Southeast




#### **Transit Safety: Community Outreach Transit Team (COTT) Booth\***








#### **Transit Safety: Community Outreach Response In Transit Spaces\***

## **Transit Safety Next Steps: Winter Plan**



Data-driven, coordinated partner effort

- Includes Extreme Weather Response partners
- Provides transportation to emergency shelter spaces
  - Two nightly bus routes
  - Includes support from Boyle
     Street Community Services

Over 300 riders have used the service so far

 Work underway to increase ridership
