
# Analysis of >65,000 Calls for Medical Service





# **EMS Response Prioritization System**

Purple	Immediately life threatening (Cardiac / Respiratory arrest)
Red	Immediately life threatening or time critical
Orange	Urgent / Potentially serious but not immediately life threatening
Yellow	Non-urgent (Not serious or life threatening)
Blue	Non-urgent (Not serious or life threatening) – evaluation of alternative (non-EMS) response when available **(to be introduced at a later date)

## **Projected Outcomes**

Projected medical call reduction of 31%, maintaining 2023 call volumes

Defer immediate need for a light fleet unit (or 'Medical Response Unit')

Improve response time performance of outlying stations by almost 2 minutes
