

Transit Priority Measures

First phase of locations:

- Hewes Way (23 Avenue to 28 Avenue)
- Jasper Avenue (109 Street to 95 Street)
- Jasper Avenue and 95 Street
- Jasper Avenue and 97 Street
- Jasper Avenue and 105 Street
- Jasper Avenue and 106 Street
- 97 Street (107 Avenue to 118 Avenue)
- 101 Street (Kingsway to Jasper Avenue)
- 109 Street and 97 Avenue
- 118 Avenue and 80 Street
- Whyte Avenue (109 Street and 99 Street)



Next Steps for Transit Priority Measures

- ☐ Planning phase is expected to be completed by the end of Q2 2024
- Measures will include a combination of:
 - Queue jumps
 - Signal retiming and/or upgrades
 - Transit signal priority (TSP) systems and technologies
 - ☐ Lane modifications to permit buses and local access only
 - ☐ Parking removal/restrictions
- ☐ Preliminary and detailed design will start following the concept phase. The work is scheduled to be completed by 2026.
