

COMMUNITY AND PUBLIC SERVICES COMMITTEE Controlled Drug and Substances Act Section 56(1) Exemption Process (M. Janz)

Recommendation of the Committee

- 1. That Administration work collaboratively with stakeholders (including but not limited to Alberta Health Services, Alberta Health, Edmonton Police Services, public health and medical experts, people with lived experience, family and patient advocates, and Indigenous peoples) to develop recommendations to reduce drug poisoning injuries and deaths in Edmonton, including providing recommendations to pursue a section 56(1) exemption to the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* to decriminalize simple personal possession (excluding trafficking) of illicit substances in Edmonton.
- 2. That Administration develop an intergovernmental advocacy strategy to reduce drug poisoning injury and deaths in Edmonton, including decriminalization of simple personal possession, safe supply, safe consumption sites, treatment and supportive housing.
