





















## **Our Request**

- 1) The City Prohibit the Sale of "Restricted Knives" at locations that hold a minor or major business licence.
- 2) That the city create a separate business license for "restricted knives", similar to that which has been created for the sale of firearms.
- 3) Similar to a firearm license, businesses wanting to obtain a license to sell "restricted knives" would have to meet requirements set out by the Edmonton Police Service, including but not limited to the following:
  - a. Limits on the number of restricted knives that can be sold to an individual
  - b. Minimum age requirement of purchaser (i.e. 18)
  - c. Purchasers providing identification that would allow the police to track the owner of a "restricted knife."

## **Definition of "Restricted Knife"**

- A) Any knife with finger indentations or holes in the handle to assist with gripping the knife.
- B) Any knife with a blade that has been sharpened on two or more sides
- C) Any knife with a mechanism that helps snap open the blade
- D) Any knife that has a blade in excess of two inches that folds back into the handle of the knife
- E) Any Knife that has a curved blade
- F) Any Knife that has a self-concealing blade and can be opened with one hand
