## **Centre City Service Levels**

As part of the Centre City Pilot, enhanced service levels were identified for tasks that were completed exclusively by the Centre City team, as well as for some tasks that were identified and triaged by Centre City and sent to other teams to complete.

The 2022 column demonstrates base service levels before the City Centre pilot began. Council approved one-time funding to extend the pilot until July 31, 2024, after which service levels would return to the base levels seen in 2022. If the pilot were to end on July 31, impacts would include seasonal staff lay-offs mid-season, inconsistent service levels (changing mid-summer), and inconsistent support during the busy event/festival season. In order to avoid those impacts, Administration plans to stretch the one-time enhancement funding to October 31. This would provide more consistency in service levels through spring, summer and fall and allow for a second year of data gathering for the Centre City Pilot. However, by extending the funding over a longer period of time, certain enhancements offered in 2023 will not be offered in 2024.

## Tasks Identified and triaged by the Centre City Team but assigned to other teams to complete the work

The Centre City Inspector Team also proactively identified issues that were sent for service to other functional areas. Issues were logged and scheduled as part of regular future work. This included servicing playgrounds and splash pads, traffic barriers and pylons, fence maintenance, \*\*expanded graffiti clean-up, guardrail maintenance, minor structure maintenance, streetscape maintenance, staircase maintenance, sportsfield asset repair, boardwalk structural repairs, pothole repair, asphalt path repair, gravel path repair, collector trip hazard repair, tree pruning, street cleaning/sweeping, line painting, deterrent post maintenance, entrance feature maintenance, jersey barrier maintenance, retaining wall maintenance, furniture repairs, trash container repairs, pothole repair, road and alley patching, concrete and brick/paving stone repair, hard surface repairs, bike path repair, parking lot asphalt repair, collector brick and paving stone repair, collector curb and gutter and ramp repair, collector panel repair and collector trip hazard repair.
