

This annual report has been developed to meet the requirements of Bylaw 18156 - Council Committees Bylaw, which sets out the annual reporting requirements for Council Committees. Under Bylaw 18156, all Council Committees will:

- Report to Council at least annually.
- Approve a work plan that aligns with Council's strategic objectives and the Council Committee's mandate, including a reporting of what resources were provided in the previous year and the anticipated resource requirements for the upcoming year.
- Report to Council and during its annual report to Council, a Council Committee must present the work plan as well as a summary of the status of the previous year's work plan.

Mandate of Edmonton Salutes Committee (ESC)

The mandate of ESC will be to:

- (a) provide advice to Council regarding appropriate official civic recognition initiatives for the military, veterans, and their families;
- (b) provide leadership as champions of the military, veterans, and their families; and
- (c) provide recognition of military members and veterans, and their families, by championing causes and sustaining meaningful collaborations with public, private, and non-profit organizations.

Report on 2023 Work Plan Goals and Accomplishments

In 2023, the ESC continued implementing their Strategic Plan (see Table 1 for list of goals and results) by attending and sponsoring events that recognize and support Military members, veterans and their families. By supporting efforts like fundraising for the Military Family Resource Centre (MFRC) or attending Remembrance Day Ceremonies, ESC members strive to ensure Military members, veterans and their families feel like they belong and are welcome in their communities. This is especially important for military families who often move from community to community as a part of their service. A welcoming community that has access to

supports; wellness activities; education; cultural connections and economic opportunities, is needed for our military members. To know their families will be healthy and safe as they find stability in a new community, and especially when they are deployed or when they retire, is why a member would choose Edmonton as their permanent home.

In 2023, the Committee continued to sponsor events related to the ESC Mandate, as well as found new opportunities to connect with partners they have not traditionally worked with in the past (see Table 2 for list of Events Engaged with in 2023). This year, the Chair attended several more events, meetings and luncheons on behalf of ESC. At these events, he networked and often brought back relevant community information or presentations to the Committee. ESC members reported great attendance and successes at recognizing the service of our Military and the support that helps our forces and their families.

Budget

The ESC started 2023 with \$64,000 budgeted towards sponsoring and attending events, supporting local military related organizations, advertising and hosting and attending meetings. 2023 spending totalled \$63,295.28 of the allocated budget.

Key Results	 Funded local organizations that provide valuable services to military and veterans in need. Committee members, and occasionally the Chair separately, supported over 19 military related events in 2023 as outlined in Table 2.
Summary of Progress	Many Military events include community members, who may be active or retired military personnel and/or family. ESC presence shows the community that the City appreciates and values the Military. This is in line with The City Plan's guiding values of Belong and Preserve. As well, by supporting organizations such as MFRC and Veterans Food Bank, the Committee was able to impact military members, veterans and their families in a positive way. This contributes to a Healthy City.
Goal 2	Community and Military Relations

Key Results	 Committee meetings engaged all members, including those from other municipalities, organizations and community representatives through shared goals and exchange of ideas. In-person event participation increased awareness of the ESC amongst the military and veteran community. Guest speakers (listed below) were invited to join select ESC Meetings throughout the year. By allowing members from the community to join and share with the Committee, members were able to learn about local military initiatives and provide support where they could. Summary of Progress	The Committee is composed of members from diverse military backgrounds that have connections with other industry groups. Through regular attendance of meetings and events with these community members, ESC further developed community and military relationships, including the Edmonton Elks.
Goal 3	Effective Governance
Key Results (by Subcommittee)	 Strategic Action: Met three times in 2023. Spearheaded the relationship with the Edmonton Elks and sponsored game tickets for military members and their families. Membership & Orientation: Met once in April 2023 and oriented a new community member. Budget: Met five times in 2023, reviewed nine funding requests, recommended the ESC approve eight out of the nine requests. Bylaw & Policy: Met once in June 2023. Recommended the addition of Morinville to the ESC as a voting member. The ESC approved their recommendation and the bylaw was to be updated in 2024.
Summary of Progress	ESC was able to successfully fulfill their mandate in 2023 through the work of the four subcommittees who met as needed throughout the year.
