		The projects subcommittee is tasked with empowering, educating, and mobilizing Edmonton youth through the execution of initiatives; the branch of CEYC that is most youth-facing. There are 2 main things the City of Edmonton and admin need to provide for the projects	

		subcommittee to be successful: funding and staff support. Funding allows initiatives to thrive and do things like book spaces, purchase food for youth attending initiatives, provide honorariums to expert guests/speakers, and procure physical items needed to run the initiative. Staff support is also essential in ensuring initiatives are coordinated, organized, and run in accordance with CEYC requirements. The projects subcommittee typically has bi-weekly meetings, as well as weekly or bi-weekly meetings for the separate initiative teams. We need this dedicated time to focus on initiatives to best serve youth in Edmonton The Projects Subcommittee plays a vital role in connecting with Edmonton's youth, promoting engagement in municipal affairs, and mobilizing young people to address local challenges. The existence of the subcommittee allows for the needed time to plan events. CEYC general assemblies then can be used for feedback and approval of work.

- Alignment with Initiatives: It focuses on the current key initiatives of Anti-Racism,
 Engagement, and Community Safety and
 Wellbeing, ensuring youth voices are considered in addressing pressing social issues.
- Support for CEYC's Goals: By empowering youth to participate meaningfully in local government, the subcommittee aligns with the City of Edmonton Youth Council's goal #3.
- Engagement and Feedback: Actively participating in engagement opportunities with City
 Administration ensures youth perspectives are integrated into policy formulation, fostering collaboration and inclusivity in decision-making.

The Policy Subcommittee is integral because it is the only means for CEYC to directly interact, engage and communicate policy changes to the City Council. Through our survey data collection, we work to align city policy and initiatives with youth values, interests and concerns. Applying a youth perspective empowers youth to access problems arising from misalignments and recommendations that could fill these gaps. At present, we have three running initiatives. The initiative's pillars integrate experiential knowledge supported by data collection and analysis. The material products of the sub-committee are policy drafts and papers.

The YAL members bring additional capacity to complete the work of this subcommittee and provide additional perspectives and lived experiences.

It also enables CEYC to have more representation when presenting to council or when speaking at a committee meeting or public hearing. As CEYC members are largely students, having a larger group of youth available, can provide more ability for daytime availability to speak with council and administration.

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		This support includes fostering direct connections between City administration, local stakeholders, and youth council members, supporting members with accessing city-related information, and getting strategic and analytical support through consultations in processing draft policy papers. The Policy Subcommittee facilitates youth involvement in municipal governance, contributing to more equitable and responsive communities in Edmonton. The existence of the subcommittee allows for more intensive and dedicated time put towards researching, crafting responses, and soliciting engagement from youth external to CEYC. CEYC general assemblies then can be used for feedback and approval of the work.

- Sustainability and Growth: The subcommittee fosters continuity within CEYC by organizing bonding events and identifying development opportunities, ensuring its long-term sustainability and effectiveness.

The Internal subcommittee supports the other subcommittees by ensuring all the back-end work is being completed in an orderly fashion such that Policy and Project subcommittees are able to focus on their goals for the term. The Internal subcommittee is also integral in ensuring City of Edmonton Youth Council members are a part of an inclusive environment that provides a space for the youth to develop their skills while receiving assistance in matters such as mental health. The work done on this subcommittee ranges from social media curation, member well-being events, and providing networking opportunities youth across the city often seek to advance their professional capacity.
