- Both aspirational and achievable

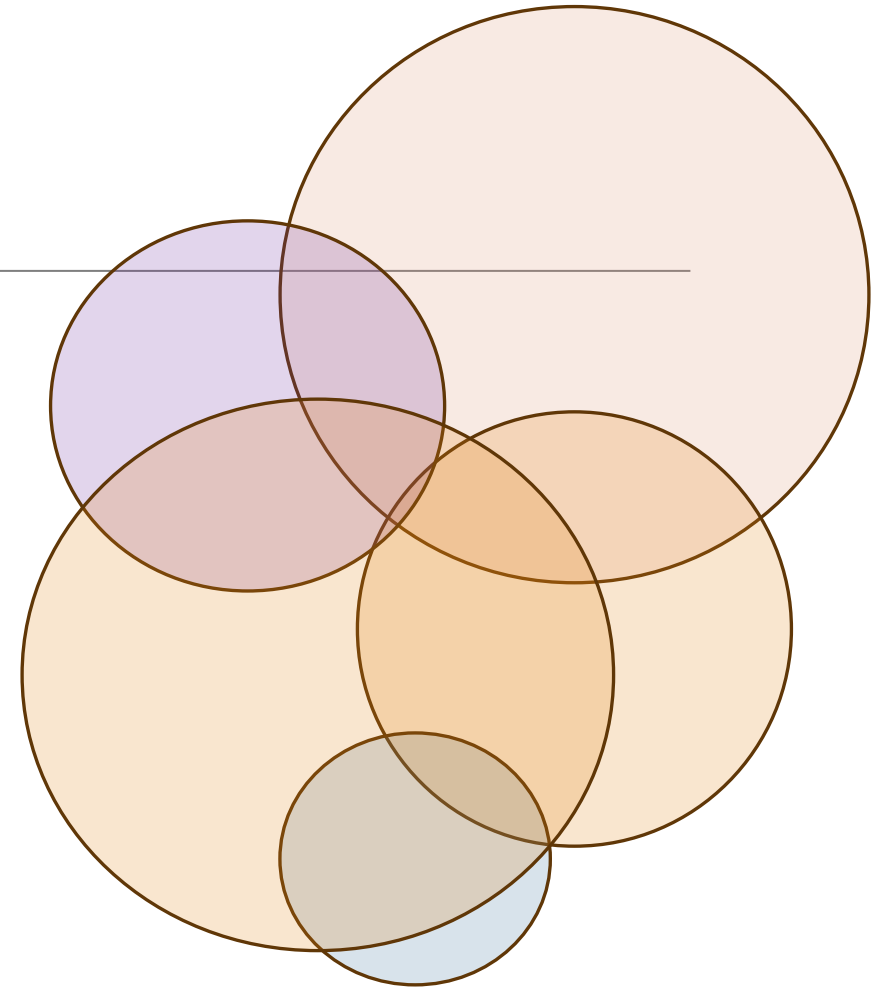
## What it is not

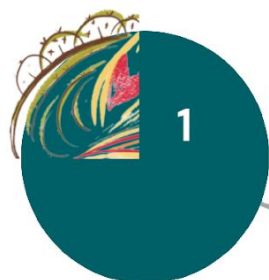

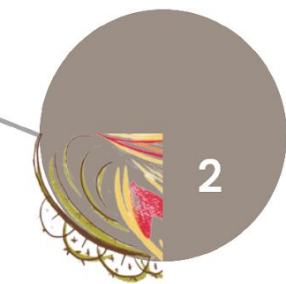

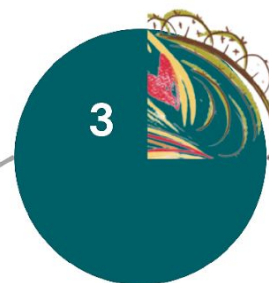
## Spring 2023

- “What We Learned” reporting to City of Edmonton Council – CS01661



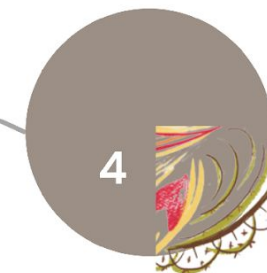
## Summer–Fall 2023

- Broad scale engagements (150+ lived and living experience individuals, and 150+ individuals from 30+ service providers and partner organizations.)



## Winter–Spring 2024

- Targeted engagements (Homeward Trust Advisory Committees, Board of Directors)
- Development of Plan recommendations and materials



## Spring–Summer 2024

- Plan presented to City Council
- Community launch event of Community Plan

# System Framework in Action

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## INFLOW FOCUSED

### **24/7 Shelter Hubs**

- Impacts INFLOW by providing diversion activities in shelter hub, but also generates OUTFLOW in having embedded housing workers within shelter

### **Navigation & Support Centre**

- All service features at the NSC (healthcare, ID, income, etc.)

### **Coordinated Access**

- Online, in person & in community

## OUTFLOW FOCUSED

### **Supportive Housing**

- All Supportive Housing projects provide important OUTFLOW from the experience of homelessness, with emphasis on providing outflow for people who have complex needs and require greater levels of support

### **Case Management in Community**

- Range of intensity, duration and progressive supports





# Connecting to Housing

## Entryways Into System

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- Prioritizing rapid-access interventions such as:
  - Bridge Housing
  - Navigation & Support Centre
- Supporting 24/7 shelter hubs
- Housing focused engagement in community settings
- Referral system transparency



# Programming Development Over Time

Over **100** Programs, Projects & Interventions supported by Homeward Trust.

2010

Less than 35 programs, projects and interventions were supported by the Edmonton Housing Trust Fund.

2024

Over **16,000** housings since the 1<sup>st</sup> housing supports program

Over **1800** Individuals can currently be supported by housing programs with **currently 644 Supportive Housing** spaces open or under development

# Robust Data Infrastructure & Analytics

Homeward Trust Data Pipeline

A longitudinal data pipeline that dates back to **2009**  
supported by Homeward Trust.

Over **31,000** unique individual client files  
encompassing the history of interactions with the  
homeless-serving sector since 2009

Coordinated Access system reviews over

**6000** Individual files per year. This includes people  
who are screened by partner agencies, seek services from the  
homeless-serving sector, and are prioritized for housing  
supports

Currently over **3000** active individual files  
documenting the experience of participants accessing the  
homeless-serving system

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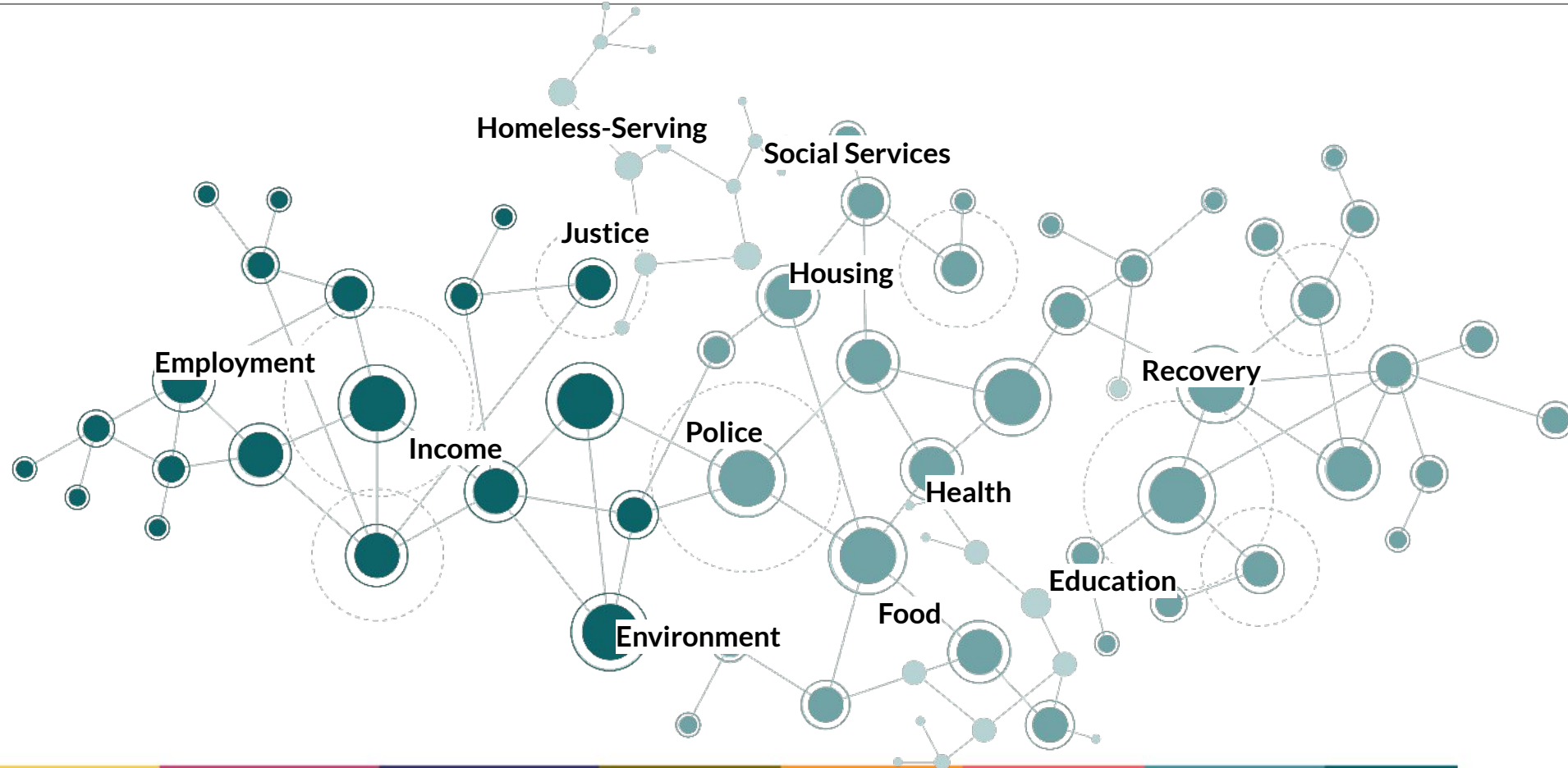

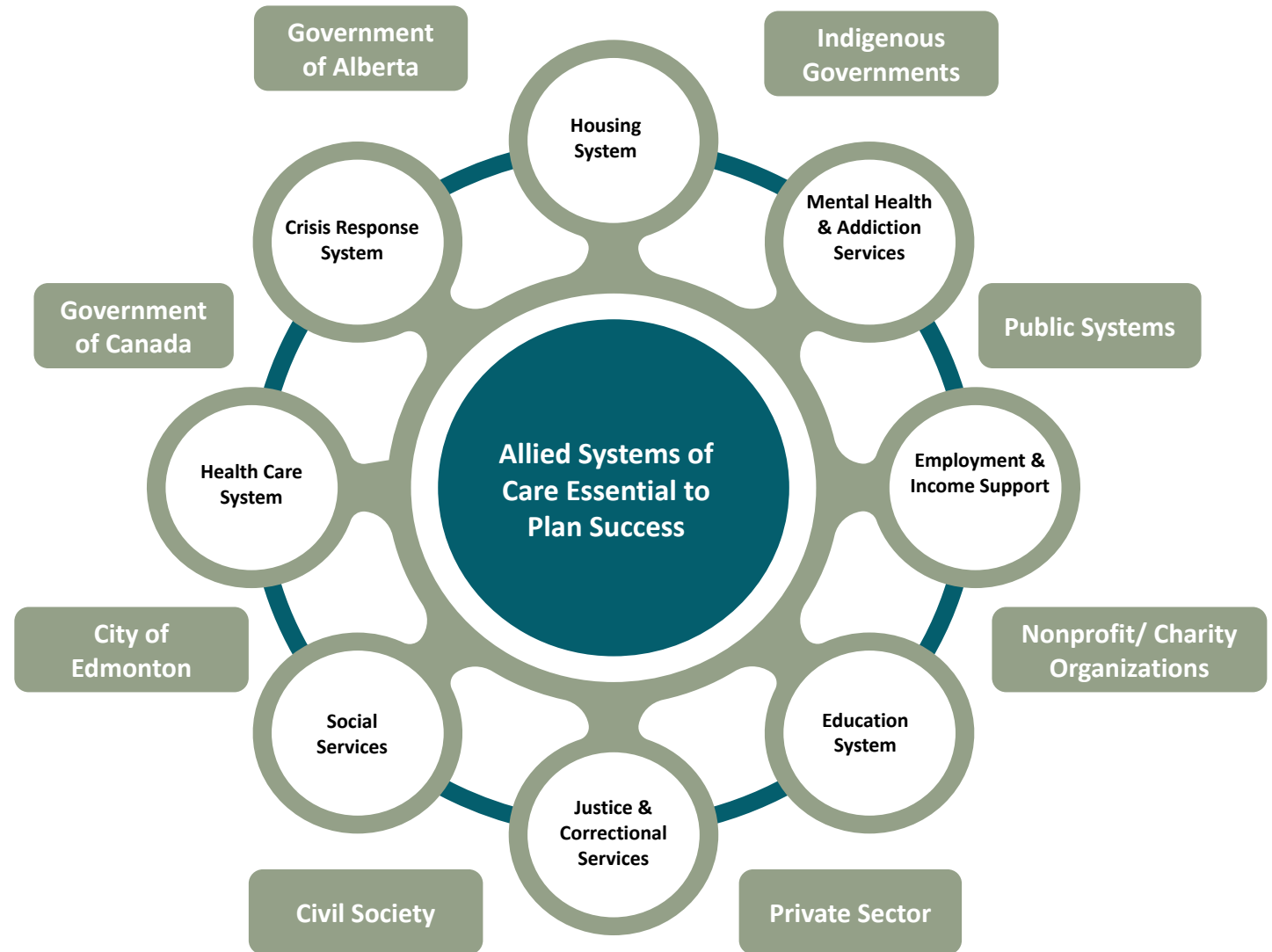
