New Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF)

HAF Action Plan Approved by Council June 15, 2023 and agreement announced by COE and CMHC on February 20, 2024 - \$175 million

Operating requirements approved by Council at 2024 Spring SOBA - \$4.5 million

New Housing Accelerator Fund Initiatives and Related Projects profile to incentivize 5,236 new housing units by 2026 - \$170.7 million



Renewal Program Funding Levels

Original 2023-2026 Capital Budget Renewal Funding Gap: \$1.63 billion

Fall 2023 SCBA funded \$15.3 million


Spring 2024 SCBA recommends funding:

- Unfunded items that scored an 8, 9 or 10 for 2024, 2025 and 2026
- Unfunded items that scored a 7 for 2024 and 2025, with the exception of conventional buses. Conventional buses were partially funded for 2025

- The Corporate Funding Pool is comprised of the following Funding Sources:
 - Pay-As-You-Go,
 - Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI)
 - Local Government Fiscal Framework (LGFF)
 - Canada Community-Building Fund (CCBF)
- Funds are held to address future budget needs and manage emerging items
