C566 - Speed Reduction Policy Approved by City Council on October 3, 2012	This policy is redundant due to the successful implementation of the 40 km/h Default Residential Speed Bylaw (Charter Bylaw 19282).
C514 - Guidelines for the Implementation of Safety Measures Around Schools Approved by City Council on January 17, 2006	This policy is outdated and redundant for the following reasons: safety reviews have been completed at all schools in Edmonton; the policy references an outdated bylaw (Traffic Bylaw 5590, Section 1008) and speaks to School Zones which are now Playground Zones; new programs are in place to address safety around schools including the Safe Routes to School Program and the Vision Zero School Kit program; and, the 30 km/h Playground speed limit is captured in the Speed Zones Bylaw (Bylaw 6894).
C590 - Community Traffic Management Approved by City Council on April 5, 2017	This policy is redundant due to the implementation of the <i>Safe Mobility Strategy 2021 - 2025</i> and specifically the Community Activation Programs (i.e. Vision Zero Street Labs, Safe Speeds Toolkit and Vision Zero School Kit), which use adaptable, traffic calming measures and other tools such as portable Driver Feedback Signs, community signage and educational materials to address speeding and shortcutting in residential neighbourhoods.
C214 - Reporting of Assessment Adjustments Processed Between Property Tax Bylaw and Billing Periods Approved by City Council on January 30, 2002	This policy was created to address large swings in assessment value between tax bylaw and tax billing, which was likely to mitigate significant legislative change that took place in the late 90's. Those swings no longer take place between tax bylaw and billing, so updating Council is no longer required. Smaller variances that result from assessment corrections are still reported to the budget office for final true-ups.
C537 Community Capital Funding Requests – Building Canada Fund Policy Approved by City Council on July 17, 2008	This policy is no longer relevant: the Building Canada Fund has ended and the policy was created to deal with the specific situation when the Saville Centre was being built.

Approved by Council on April 19, 2021	Recommendation: Amend the Review Date to delete and replace "April 21, 2024" with "May 2, 2026." Justification: The C627 Climate Resilience Policy was approved by City Council on April 19, 2021, at the same time as the revised Community Energy Transition Strategy. The Community Energy Transition Strategy is scheduled for review by May 2, 2026 per the requirements of the City of Edmonton Charter, 2018 Regulation. It is proposed that the review date of the C627 Climate Resilience Policy be extended to align with the review of the Community Energy Transition Strategy. This will ensure continued alignment between these two key strategic documents.
C593A - Public Engagement Policy Approved by Council on June 7, 2021	Recommendation: Amend the Review Date to delete and replace "June 7, 2024" with "December 2, 2025." Justification: The C593A Public Engagement Policy was approved by City Council on June 7, 2021 and is scheduled for review on June 7, 2024. It is proposed that the review date be extended to June 1, 2025, to allow for additional time to collect input from Council, project teams, the public and stakeholders to ensure any proposed changes reflect the diverse needs and perspectives of our community. The OP12 process identified engagement concepts related to reduced levels for non-legally required items and infrastructure projects. Administration will incorporate these elements into the policy and public engagement framework to ensure methods and scope of engagement continue to support stakeholders' needs.
